Non-rechargeable - **more than 2 grams of lithium**

FORBIDDEN ON PASSENGER AIRCRAFT

Rechargeable - **above 160 Wh**

Must only be carried as Cargo/Freight in accordance with DG Regulations

Watt hours (Wh) = Amps (Ah) x Voltage (v)

SPARE BATTERIES MAY NOT BE PLACED IN CHECKED BAGGAGE AT ANY TIME

BATTERIES CONTAINED IN EQUIPMENT MUST BE SWITCHED OFF AND PROTECTED FROM ACCIDENTAL ACTIVATION

ANY OTHER BATTERY TYPE NOT LISTED MUST BE ASSESSED BY THE DG COORDINATOR AND MAY REQUIRE DG ACCEPTANCE VIA A FREIGHT AGENT
